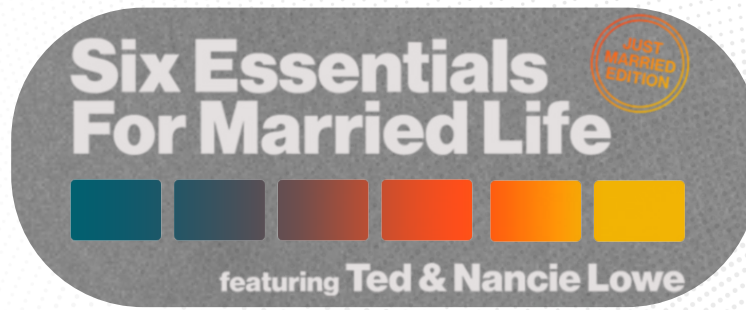




PART 3: TRUST GOD AND FINISH TOGETHER

CONNECT

Take a few minutes to discuss this question in your group:

What's one photo or memory from your wedding that always makes you smile? What does it remind you of?

LEARN

After praying, watch the video for Part 3.

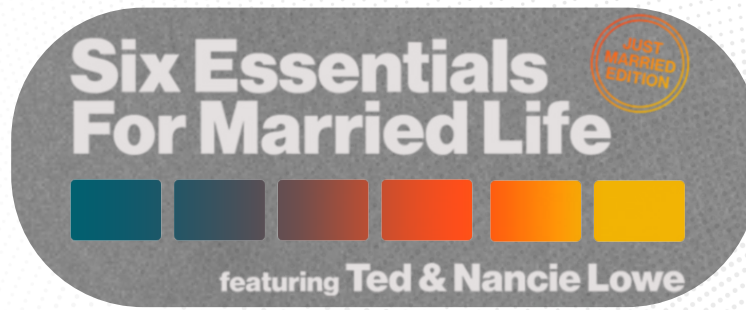
APPLY

After the video, discuss the following questions as a group:

1. What's a season you've walked through that stretched your faith? What did you learn through that experience?
2. Ted and Nancie shared that difficult seasons can change our prayers from, "God, why is this happening?" to "God, what do you want to do in me?" Why is that shift important? What prevents us from being open to seeing what God may want to do in us?
3. What's one area of your life where you're relying on your own strength instead of trusting God? What's one step of faith you could take this week?
4. Read **Ecclesiastes 4:12**.

Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.

What does this passage teach us about facing life together? What are some practical ways we can intentionally keep God at the center of our marriage?



5. Ted and Nancie said that finishing together happens “one decision at a time.” What are some everyday choices that quietly strengthen—or weaken—a marriage over time?
6. How could asking, “Will this help us finish well?” change the way you make decisions as a couple?

MOVING FORWARD

This week...

Act

Choose one challenge, concern, or decision you’re facing as a couple and spend a few minutes praying about it together.

Ask

Ask each other:

“What’s one small thing I could do more intentionally that would help us finish well together?”

PRAY

Close in prayer, thanking God that we belong to him. Here’s a sample prayer you can use:

Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of marriage. Help us to trust you in every season and make choices today that strengthen our marriage for tomorrow. Teach us to keep pursuing each other, to keep you at the center of our relationship, and to build a marriage that honors you for a lifetime. Amen.
