



PART 4: DON'T MISS GREAT

Great is not the same as famous. In fact, you may know some famous people and they're not really all that great. Not everyone will have the opportunity to be famous, but everyone has the opportunity to be great.

CONNECT

If you could be famous for a day, what would your “claim to fame” be?

LEARN

You will watch a shortened version of a message from this series to set up your group discussion. Watch the full message sometime this week as a reminder of what you talked about today.

APPLY

After sharing what stood out from the video, discuss the following questions as a group:

1. What differences do you see between cultural greatness and Jesus-shaped greatness?
2. **Read Mark 10:42–45:**

Jesus called them together and said, “You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.”

3. Where do you feel the tension between “how the world works” and “how the kingdom works” in your own day-to-day leadership, work, or relationships?
4. If greatness is expressed through serving others, what could “running to the back of the line” look like in an actual scenario this week? This could be at home, at work, on campus, or in your personal relationships.
5. Andy talks about the cumulative value of choosing greatness consistently. What small, repeatable opportunities do you most often overlook, and what might help you catch them?



WRAP UP

Pick a specific area of your life (professionally, relationally, financially, spiritually, health-ally) and take time to prayerfully consider what should be/could be.

Heavenly Father, thank you for redefining greatness. Give us the clarity to see the opportunities right in front of us, the courage to step to the back of the line, and the humility to serve the way you modeled. Shape us into people whose everyday choices reflect your kingdom. Amen.
